SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 11

Congratulating Susan Corrock.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE:

WHEREAS Susan Corrock of Ketchum, Idaho, a member of the United States ski team at the 1972 Winter Olympics at Sapporo, Japan, was the bronze medalist in the women's downhill competition; and

WHEREAS her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Jack Corrock, are without question the inspirational encouragement behind Susan's success in international ski competition where she is known as one of the most outstanding personalities on the United States team, not only in terms of her skiing ability but also for her dedication, character and winning personality on the slopes as well as in her nonathletic activities; and

WHEREAS her mother, Lila Corrock, was born and raised in Cordova, Alaska, thus linking her daughter, Susan, with the traditional interest of Alaskans in winter sports;
