SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 27

Honoring Alice H. Brown.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS Alice H. Brown has recently met with an untimely death after a long illness; and

WHEREAS Mrs. Brown was a lifelong Alaskan who, over the years, gave of herself selflessly to many causes in order to better her community of Anchorage and the state; and

WHEREAS during her long and able career she did and accomplished a myriad of things including serving as a member of the board of directors of the Alaska Federation of Natives; as chairman of the Alaska Native Political Education Committee; as a member of the Rural Affairs Commission; as field representative of the Kenaitze Indian Association; as a member of the board of directors of both the Jesse Lee Home and Hope Cottage; among many other activities; and

WHEREAS she, in addition to her numerous other activities and responsibilities, spent countless hours working on passage of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Legislature that it expresses its most profound sense of loss at the passing of Alice H. Brown, but affirms and states its view that her life and her devotion to her fellow Alaskans will long stand as an example to those who may follow in her footsteps.
