SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 35

Honoring Katsutaro "Slicker" Komatsubara.

BE IT RESOLVED

BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS Katsutaro Komatsubara, long-time Juneau resident and co-owner of the City Cafe, has recently passed away; and

WHEREAS all Alaskans who were privileged to have known "Slicker", as he was affectionately known, will miss this rare human being who possessed an indomitable wit through thick and thin; and

WHEREAS "Slicker" was one of those Americans who suffered the indignation of being interned in a relocation center during World War II and yet never lost his faith in America and in his adopted Alaska; and

WHEREAS throughout the years "Slicker", in his everyday life, contributed in many small but important ways to the betterment of Juneau and all of its citizens;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska Legislature laments the passing of Katsutaro "Slicker" Komatsubara but affirms its faith that the memory of Mr. Komatsubara will long remain for countless numbers of Alaskans who counted him among their friends.
