HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 75

Relating to the boundaries of the Chugach State Park.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS the commissioner of the Department of Natural Resources, in the exercise of his management responsibilities over the Chugach State Park, has encountered conflicts of land ownership, jurisdiction or authority which are unreconcilable or unmanageable other than at an unreasonable cost and expense to the state; and

WHEREAS the commissioner has held public hearings in accordance with AS 44.62 to modify the boundaries of the Chugach State Park; and

WHEREAS the modifications of the boundaries do not exceed 20 per cent of the total acreage described in AS 41.20.210;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Alaska State Legislature that the following changes in the boundaries of the Chugach State Park are approved and may be submitted to the lieutenant governor for filing:

(1) Delete the lands lying within the city limits of Girdwood in T10N, R2E, S.M.;

(2) Delete the lands south and west of and adjacent to the toe of the bluff which extends from Campbell Point southeasterly to Potter Creek which have been designated as the Potter Point State Game Refuge which lie within the Chugach State Park in T11N, R3W, S.M., Sec. 10;

(3) Delete the following land which is an isolated

parcel of foreclosed land not contiguous to the park:

T16N, R2E, S.M., Sec. 9 - USS 3070.
