## HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 6

Relating to federal aid for the elimination of ice fog in the Fairbanks area.

### BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA :

WHEREAS during most of the winter months the Fairbanks area is annually plagued by the phenomenon commonly known as ice fog; and

WHEREAS ice fog conditions create extremely hazardous conditions for the people in the area, including but not limited to severe traffic problems, real danger to health, and intolerable risks for children en route to and from school; and

WHEREAS the theoretical and applied research requisite for elimination of ice fog is, at this time, beyond the fiscal capability of the state, the North Star Borough, or the city to fund; and

WHEREAS Fairbanks has experienced and will continue to experience a massive influx of people and motor vehicles because of the construction of the Alaska pipeline, thus further aggravating what is already a serious problem;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Alaska State Legislature that the Congress of the United States is urgently requested to appropriate the required funds so that the necessary theoretical and applied research aimed at the elimination of ice fog can begin at the earliest possible time.
