SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 29

Relating to the Consumer Protection Act of 1975.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS S. 200, the Consumer Protection Act of 1975, is currently pending before the United States Congress; and

WHEREAS if this legislation were enacted it would establish an independent, nonregulatory Agency for Consumer Advocacy to speak for consumers in our Nation's capital; and

WHEREAS the proposed agency would be authorized to advocate the interests of consumers before federal agencies and courts and would provide the American public with information about consumer matters; and

WHEREAS the agency would act as a clearinghouse for consumer complaints and would maintain an up-to-date file of complaints for public inspection; and

WHEREAS the creation of the Agency for Consumer Advocacy would benefit each and every citizen of this great country;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Alaska State Legislature that it staunchly supports the creation of the Agency for Consumer Advocacy and urges the United States Congress to take early affirmative action enacting the proposal.
