## SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 30

Relating to proposed regulations to restrict the sale of handgun ammunition.

### BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS the United States Consumer Product Safety Commission currently has under consideration a proposal to restrict handgun ammunition as a hazardous substance such as dynamite under the Consumer Product Safety Act; and

WHEREAS the Alaska Department of Fish and Game has taken the position that the proposed regulation is not in the best interest of Alaskans; and

WHEREAS such a regulation would adversely affect thousands of Alaskans from every walk of life; and

WHEREAS it is vital that the proposed regulation not be enacted;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Alaska State Legislature that it vigorously opposes any attempt to classify handgun ammunition as a hazardous substance and urgently requests the Consumer Product Safety Commission to totally reject the proposal.

COPIES of this resolution shall be sent to the United States Consumer Product Safety Commission and to the Honorable Ted Stevens and the Honorable Mike Gravel, U. S. Senators, and the Honorable Don Young, U. S. Representative, members of the Alaska delegation in congress.
