AN ACT

Relating to nurses; and providing for an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 08.68.170 is amended to read:

Sec. 08.68.170. QUALIFICATIONS OF PROFESSIONAL NURSE APPLICANTS. An applicant for a license to practice professional nursing shall submit to the board on forms and in the manner prescribed by the board, written evidence, verified by oath, that the applicant has completed an approved four year high school course of study or the equivalent as determined by the appropriate educational agency, and has successfully completed (1) a professional nursing education program accredited by the board; or (2) a professional nursing education program outside the state which, in the opinion of the board, meets the minimum requirements of the board for an accredited program of study in this state at the time the applicant graduated; or (3) a professional nursing education program accredited by the National League for Nursing at the time the applicant graduated.

* Sec. 2. AS 08.68.180(a) is amended to read:

(a) An applicant for a license to practice practical nursing shall submit to the board on forms prescribed by the board written evidence, verified by oath, that the applicant has completed the tenth grade or its equivalent as determined by the appropriate educational agency, is not less than 18 years of age, and has successfully completed (1) a practical nursing education program accredited by the board; or (2) a practical nursing education program outside the state which, in the opinion of the board, meets the minimum requirements of the board for an accredited program of study in this state.
