HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 130

Honoring Celia Hunter as the newly elected President of the Wilderness Society.

BE IT RESOLVED

BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS Celia Hunter has been one of the main driving forces in Alaska for protection of the environment; and

WHEREAS this deep concern resulted in the early formation of the Alaska Conservation Society, with a rapidly growing membership of those who share her feelings about the environment; and

WHEREAS her respect for the land is also shown by her long-term co-ownership of Camp Denali, which is maintained as a wilderness camp to introduce persons to the benefits of wilderness and outdoor life and which was recently cited by the Society of American Travel Writers for excellence; and

WHEREAS, in addition, Celia has recently served the state's interest admirably as a member of the Joint Federal-State Land Use Planning Commission; and

WHEREAS it is for her untiring devotion to the public good through conservation that she was recently elected as president of the Wilderness Society, a prestigious national conservation organization;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature recognizes Celia Hunter's long-term commitment to conservation and congratulates her on becoming the new president of the Wilderness Society, an honor that she well deserves.
