HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 136

Honoring Eleanor L. Sullivan.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS the death of Eleanor L. Sullivan of Anchorage this past week represents a loss to that community and the state of a highly esteemed activist in business and community affairs; and

WHEREAS Miss Sullivan came to Alaska in 1950 with a background in banking and for 25 years was with the First National Bank of Anchorage, serving at the time of her death as an assistant vice-president in the areas of advertising, marketing and community affairs; and

WHEREAS during her quarter of a century in Anchorage Eleanor Sullivan distinguished herself not only in the banking business but as a tireless and effective civic booster, particularly in connection with the Anchorage Concert Association, the Alaska Festival of Music, the Soroptimist Club, the Business and Professional Women's Club, Greater Anchorage, Inc., the Catholic Daughters of America, and numerous other activities; and

WHEREAS her business and community service very early and most effectively demonstrated that a woman could play a vital role in the business world and civic enterprise and merit the esteem and affection of her associates and fellow citizens;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Alaska State Legislature that the family of Eleanor L. Sullivan is herewith advised of the special regard and appreciation with which the people of Alaska salute the memory of their sister who merits the description of the poet Halleck - "None knew thee but to love thee, nor named thee but to praise."
