SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 75

Relating to the development of a family law code.

BE IT RESOLVED

BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS, under the current arrangement of the Alaska Statutes, the laws pertaining to the family unit and, in particular, children, are spread throughout several titles; and

WHEREAS the general area of family law is a continually growing and expanding discipline and especially as regards the rights of children; and

WHEREAS attorneys and laymen alike have, under Alaska's present statutory system, similar difficulties in ferreting out and determining what laws pertain to family relationships and society's posture to those relationships and individual persons in any given circumstance; and

WHEREAS it would be extremely beneficial to attorneys, laymen and administrators of the various state and local agencies who have duties and responsibilities with regard to children and other family matters to have a complete and separate compilation of family law in one individual title of the Alaska Statutes;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Alaska State Legislature that the Legislative Council be directed to review the existing laws relating to children specifically and the family in general so as to provide for a systematic arrangement of "family law" in the Alaska Statutes and to accomplish any necessary revision to harmonize conflicts, supply omissions, and generally clarify and make complete in one body of law Alaska's family law.
