SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 76

Relating to a feasibility study of an integrated transportation system for Southeast Alaska.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS the State of Alaska is dependent on a smooth and efficient land and water transportation system and this is particularly true of Southeast Alaska where the demands of geography are particularly challenging to any transportation system; and

WHEREAS these challenges can be met by a proper coordination of efforts of state departments with citizen and community input; and

WHEREAS the coordinated effort should be addressed to the development of an integrated transportation system for the entire Southeastern area and should include an eye towards maximizing service through the development of permanent road linkages and the examination of the possibility for economies in the overall marine highway and regular highway systems; and

WHEREAS the Southeastern Conference on November 22, 1975 approved Conference Resolution No. 7 calling for early action on a feasibility study for an integrated transportation system in Southeast Alaska;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature respectfully requests the Governor to accomplish on a priority basis the feasibility study of an integrated transportation system for Southeast Alaska.
