SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 3

Relating to the Cook Inlet Land Trade.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE:

WHEREAS the Alaska Legislature has consented to the conditions and obligations of that certain Act, P. L. 94-204, the Cook Inlet Land Trade; and

WHEREAS concern has been voiced in the Legislature as to whether or not lands at Point Woronzof which will be transferred to the state by the federal government will be restricted in use to park and recreation purposes and not be available for use for a north-south runway at the Anchorage Airport; and

WHEREAS the state has been assured by the Department of the Interior in writing that nothing in the Cook Inlet Land Trade will restrict the right of the federal government to transfer lands to the state for airport purposes under the Airport and Airway Development Act of 1970; and

WHEREAS the Legislature is vitally concerned that the land be conveyed to the state for those purposes;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Senate has relied on the assurances of the federal government that the land at Point Woronzof will be conveyed to the state under the Airport and Airway Development Act of 1970 as a material consideration in its acceptance of the terms and conditions of the Cook Inlet Land Trade, and has accepted the trade in part on the basis of that assurance.
