AN ACT

Relating to club licenses for sale of intoxicating liquors.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 04.10.070 is amended to read:

Sec. 04.10.070. CLUB LICENSE. A club license gives to clubs, fraternal organizations, and patriotic organizations, that have a state or national charter, and that have been so incorporated and active for a period of two years or more, the right to sell intoxicating liquors to members and their families only in their club rooms. The club license fee is \$400, except that where any club has certified to the board that the gross sales of intoxicating liquor for the preceding year were less than \$5,000 the club license fee is \$200. For purposes of this section the term "member" as it applies to patriotic organizations includes military personnel on active duty in uniform upon special occasions.
