Inviting the President of the United States to address the Alaska Legislature.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS many of the issues directly concerning Alaska today, including the establishment of a 200-mile fishing zone, management practices as they relate to timber resources on federal land in the state, rehabilitation of our once bountiful salmon fisheries, development of oil and gas resources and the transportation of those resources to markets, and the identification and withdrawal of lands under sec. 17(d)(2) of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act, are also issues of major national significance; and

WHEREAS the Alaska Legislature believes that the only means of resolving these issues in a way that is in the best interests of the nation and state is through increased communication and cooperation;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tenth Alaska State Legislature hereby invites the President of the United States to address a joint session, scheduled at his convenience, concerning those issues of national significance directly concerning all Alaskans.

COPIES of this resolution shall be sent to the Honorable Jimmy Carter, President of the United States; and to the Honorable Ted Stevens and the Honorable Mike Gravel, U. S. Senators, and the Honorable Don Young, U. S. Representative, members of the Alaska delegation in Congress.
