Honoring the memory of Victor V. Gill.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

The recent death of Victor V. Gill ends the long and distinguished life of a truly remarkable Alaskan pioneer.

He came to Alaska as an infant with his parents in 1907 where they settled at Susitna Station. His father entered public life to serve in the Territorial Legislature and was the Speaker of the House during the Eighteenth Territorial Legislature.

Victor Gill, following the example set by his father, was concerned with making government work and as a result became a city councilman for the City of Anchorage from 1944 to 1946, a member of the Anchorage Planning and Zoning Commission, the Advisory Budget Committee for the City of Anchorage, and the state Local Boundary Commission.

Those who knew Victor Gill now feel a deep personal loss. He set an example of unselfish giving of his time and talents for better state and local government. The legislature expresses its most sincere condolences to his sons, Larry, Russell, and Gregory, and his daughters Christine Gill and Louise Fredrickson, on behalf of its members and the people of Alaska.
