Honoring Langhorne A. "Tony" Motley.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS Langhorne A. "Tony" Motley has served the State of Alaska as Commissioner of Commerce and Economic Development for the past two years and has submitted his resignation from that post effective February 1, 1977; and

WHEREAS during that time he was in the forefront of efforts to aid the State of Alaska and the economic interests of its citizens; and

WHEREAS the benefits of these activities resulted from his demonstrated efficiency, sound management and administrative ability; and

WHEREAS the establishment under his department of the rent review boards during the pipeline-induced housing shortage helped to alleviate differences between tenants and landlords; and
