Supporting construction of a small boat moorage basin at Anchorage.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE:

WHEREAS no small boat moorage basin currently exists in the Anchorage area where small boats may be moored; and

WHEREAS persons who own small boats must presently either moor their boats in Homer, Kenai, or Valdez or must remove their boats from the water after each use due to the absence of local facilities; and

WHEREAS the York Steel Company, Inc., has submitted an application to the United States Department of Army, Corps of Engineers, for a permit to construct a small boat moorage basin south of Ship Creek at Anchorage; and

WHEREAS the York Steel Company, Inc., proposal contains many desirable features, including 1,600 lineal feet of dock space available at all tides, a shop to support maintenance or repair work on vessels, a rail siding, and warehouse capacity for temporary storage of material or cargo; and

WHEREAS these facilities will be readily accessible to downtown Anchorage and will be of benefit for commercial and recreational uses; and

WHEREAS the York Steel Company, Inc., proposal has, to date, been underway for five years solely at the expense of private businessmen with no public expenditures of any kind;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Senate supports the York Steel Company, Inc., proposal and respectfully requests the Alaska District Corps of Engineers to issue the York Steel Company, Inc., a permit to construct these facilities.
