AN ACT

Relating to maximum benefits paid as aid to families with dependent children; and providing for an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

AN ACT

Relating to maximum benefits paid as aid to families with dependent children; and providing for an effective date.

* Section 1. AS 47.25.320(a)(1) is amended to read:

(1) dependent child living with nonneedy relative: for a child under age 18 who is living in the home of a nonneedy relative, \$175 [\$150], plus an additional \$175 [\$150] for the second child, and \$50 a child for the third and each additional child.

* Sec. 2. AS 47.25.320(a)(2)(A) is amended to read:

(A) for a parent and one child under 18, a maximum of \$400 [\$350];

* Sec. 3. AS 47.25.320 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

(d) If benefits under Title XVI of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1381 - 1385) are increased because of an increase in the cost of living, the department shall increase the monetary maximums in (a) of this section by a percentage equal to the percentage increase in benefits under Title XVI.

* Sec. 4. AS 47.25.320(c) is repealed.

* Sec. 5. Sections 1 and 2 of this Act take effect January 1, 1981.

* Sec. 6. Sections 3 - 5 of this Act take effect July 1, 1980.
