AN ACT

Relating to the Alaska Police Standards Council; and providing for an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

Relating to the Alaska Police Standards Council; and providing for an effective date.

* Section 1. AS 18.65.130 is amended to read:

Sec. 18.65.130. POLICY. The administration of criminal justice affects the health, safety and welfare of the people of this state, and requires education and training of a professional quality. It is a primary [IN THE] public interest that applicants meet minimum standards for employment as police officers and that criminal justice education and training be made available to [PERSONS SEEKING TO BECOME POLICE OFFICERS,] police officers [WHO ARE] serving in a [TEMPORARY OR] probationary capacity [,] and police officers already in regular service. It is of secondary public interest to encourage the establishment of preliminary training programs for persons seeking to become police officers.

* Sec. 2. AS 18.65.150(1) is amended to read:

(1) four chief administrative officers or chiefs of police of [PARTICIPATING] local governments;

* Sec. 3. AS 18.65.160 is amended to read:

Sec. 18.65.160. APPOINTMENT. The commissioner of public safety or his designee shall serve during his continuance in office. Other members of the council shall be appointed by the governor for staggered terms of four years, except that no member may serve beyond the time he holds the office which made him eligible for appointment. established for the employment of police officers, including but not limited to minimum age, education, physical and mental standards, citizenship, moral character, and experience. The council shall prescribe the means of presenting evidence of fulfillment of these requirements.

(c) The council may deny or revoke the certificate of a police officer who does not meet the standards adopted under (a)(2) of this section.

Sec. 18.65.250. FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE. (a) The Governor's Commission on the Administration of Justice has the authority to assist [PARTICIPATING] political subdivisions and police departments [AGENCIES] in meeting the costs involved by extending financial assistance for travel, per diem, tuition and other costs.

(b) Only those political subdivisions [LOCAL GOVERNMENTS] and police departments complying [AGENCIES ELECTING TO COMPLY] with AS 18.65.130 - 18.65.290 are eligible for financial assistance authorized under AS 44.19.116. This subsection applies only to those funds made available for providing minimum police standards.

(b) The council shall provide for and administer a funding [THE ADMINISTRATION OF A GRANT] program authorized in (a) of this section. In the administration of the program the council shall promote the most efficient and economical program for police training, including the maximum utilization of existing facilities and programs to avoid duplication.

2 local police departments are exempt from the requirements of AS 18.65.
3 240. However, a person appointed chief of a local police department
4 after July 1, 1981, who performs any operational duties, shall meet the
5 requirements of AS 18.65.240(a)(1).

6 (b) Any local government with an established police training
7 program meeting the requirements of AS 18.65.220(2) and (3) may exclude
8 itself from the requirements of AS 18.65.240 by ordinance. The exclu-
9 sion has no effect on eligibility to receive federal or state grants.

11 (2) "police officer" means a full-time employee of the
12 state or a local police department with the authority to arrest and
13 issue citations; detain a person taken into custody until that

16 and traffic laws; search with or without a warrant persons, dwellings,
17 and other forms of property for evidence of a crime; carry a concealed
