Requesting the United States Postal Service to construct a new post office building for Dillingham.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS the Dillingham Post Office presently occupies an old building that does not provide sufficient space to meet the needs of the postal customers in the area; and

WHEREAS to date efforts of various community and civic groups and leaders have not succeeded in bringing about the construction of a new post office facility; and

WHEREAS the maintenance of adequate postal facilities is of particular significance in the more remote areas of the state which depend heavily on the postal system for information and goods;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature respectfully requests the United States Postal Service to undertake the acquisition or construction of a new post office for the Dillingham area.

Bolger, Postmaster General of the United States Postal Service; Mr. Robert Preston, District Director of Customer Services, Northwestern District; and to the Honorable Ted Stevens and the Honorable Frank Murkowski, U.S. Senators, and the Honorable Don Young, U.S. Representative, members of the Alaska delegation in Congress.
