Expelling George H. Hohman, Jr., from the Senate of the State of Alaska.

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE:**

WHEREAS Senator George H. Hohman, Jr., was tried in the Superior Court for the State of Alaska, First Judicial District in Case No. 1JU-81-464-CR for the offense of bribery which is a felony in violation of AS 11.56.100 and for the offense of receiving a bribe which is a felony in violation of AS 11.56.-110 and the jury has returned verdicts finding him guilty of each offense; and

WHEREAS the Senate Rules Committee has held hearings on the question of whether Senator George H. Hohman, Jr., has committed actions for which the Senate should impose disciplinary measures and has recommended that he be expelled from the Senate; and

WHEREAS under art. II, sec. 12, Constitution of the State of Alaska, the Senate is the judge of the elections and qualifications of its members and may expel a member with concurrence of two-thirds of its members;

BE IT RESOLVED that under the powers granted to the Senate by art. II, sec. 12, Constitution of the State of Alaska, the Senate hereby expels George H. Hohman, Jr., from the Senate of the State of Alaska; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the expulsion takes effect when and if judgment of conviction by the trial court is entered in Case No. 1JU-81-464-CR; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that Senator George H. Hohman, Jr., is denied all rights, prerogatives, and privileges of office as a Senator of the State of Alaska from the adoption of this

resolution unless and until judgment of conviction is entered.
