* Section 1. AS 39.20.270 is amended to read:

Sec. 39.20.270. COURT LEAVE. Notwithstanding AS 39.20.310(7), court [COURT] leave shall be granted to an employee who is classified as full time, whether permanent, nonpermanent, or temporary. An officer or employee called to serve as a juror or subpoenaed as a witness is entitled to administrative leave with pay, but compensation received by the employee [HIM] or to which the employee [HE] is entitled, whichever is greater, for service as a juror or witness shall be deducted from pay to which the employee [HE] is entitled as a state officer or employee.
