Requesting the State Geographic Board to name an unnamed lake near Ketchikan as "Ed Todd Lake."

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS Ed Todd lost his life in an airplane accident in an unnamed lake near Big Goat Lake; and

WHEREAS Ed Todd was a man well-respected within the Ketchikan community during his life; and

WHEREAS Ed Todd was the founder of Todd's Air Service in Ketchikan in 1944 and the operator of the air service during the remainder of his life; and

WHEREAS Ed Todd spent almost all of his 59 years in the state before his untimely death; and

WHEREAS Ed Todd participated in many hours of search and rescue work during his lifetime; and

WHEREAS it is appropriate that a geographic feature within the Ketchikan area be named in his honor as permanent testimony to his memory; and

WHEREAS the unnamed lake near Big Goat Lake was a favorite goat hunting area for Ed Todd during his lifetime; and

WHEREAS the unnamed lake is located about two or three miles north of Big Goat Lake, is approximately 100 miles east of Ketchikan, and is located in sections 1 and 12, Township 73 South, Range 97 East, Copper River Meridian;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Alaska State Legislature that the State Geographic Board is requested to name the described unnamed lake as "Ed Todd Lake."
