AN ACT

Designating the woolly mammoth (*Mammuthus primigenius*) as the state fossil.

* Section 1. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. By designating the woolly mammoth (*Mammuthus primigenius*) as the state fossil, the legislature intends to give recognition to this animal that was the largest and one of the most prevalent animals in the state but whose remains are now found only as fossils.

* Sec. 2. AS 44.09 is amended by adding a new section to read:

Sec. 44.09.120. STATE FOSSIL. The woolly mammoth (*Mammuthus primigenius*) is the official state fossil.
