Relating to establishing a Joint Special Committee on state employee compensation.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS there exists considerable legislative and public concern over the issue of state employees' salaries, allowances, and other benefits; and

WHEREAS the continued decline of state revenue due to the decline of world oil prices will likely force a reduction in state operating expenditures over time; and

WHEREAS the current year's state operating budget includes personal services costs in excess of \$900,000,000; and

WHEREAS the various components of the state's current compensation plan are not sufficiently integrated or described to provide policy makers with adequate information to evaluate the overall compensation package;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Alaska State Legislature that under Uniform Rule 21 a Joint Special Committee on State Employees' Salaries and Benefits is established consisting of three members of the senate appointed by the president of the senate and three members of the house of representatives appointed by the speaker of the house to undertake a comprehensive review of the state's employee compensation package; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the committee work on this project in conjunction with representatives from the executive branch of state government; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the committee is authorized to meet during and between sessions of the legislature and is to report its recommendations and finding on the first day of the First

Session of the Fifteenth Legislature and is terminated on the first day of the First Session of the Fifteenth Legislature.
