\* Section 1. AS 19.10.060 is amended to read:

Sec. 19.10.060. REGULATION OF WEIGHT AND LOAD OF VEHICLES AND USE OF HIGHWAYS DURING CERTAIN SEASONS. The department, with respect to highways under its jurisdiction, may

(1) establish limitations on weight, size, and load of vehicles, except as otherwise provided in AS 19.10.065;

(2) [REPEALED

(3)] prohibit the operation or impose restrictions on vehicular use of highways during certain seasons of the year.

\* Sec. 2. AS 19.10 is amended by adding a new section to read:

Sec. 19.10.065. OPERATION OF FARM EQUIPMENT ON HIGHWAYS. (a) Implements of husbandry, as defined by regulation under AS 28.05.011, are not subject to restrictions adopted under AS 19.10.060(1) unless the implement is the load of another vehicle. Implements of husbandry may be operated on highways subject to the department's jurisdiction without obtaining a permit, as provided in this section.

(b) The incidental operation of an implement of husbandry up to 12 feet wide on a state highway is authorized without a permit if the implement

(1) is operated only during the period from one-half hour after sunrise to one-half hour before sunset;

1 (2) displays a slow-moving vehicle emblem on the rear of  
2 the implement;

3 (3) displays a red flag on the implement in a location that  
4 affords greatest visibility; and

5 (4) is moving from one farm operation to another within 50  
6 miles of the home base of the implement of husbandry.

7 (c) An implement of husbandry that is more than 12 feet wide may  
8 be operated on a state highway without a permit if it meets the pro-  
9 visions of (b) of this section and is preceded by a pilot car during  
10 operation on the highway.

11 \* Sec. 3. AS 28.10.011 is amended to read:

12 Sec. 28.10.011. VEHICLES SUBJECT TO REGISTRATION. Every vehicle  
13 driven, moved, or parked upon a highway or other public parking place  
14 in the state shall be registered under this chapter except when the  
15 vehicle is

16 (1) driven or moved on a highway only for the purpose of  
17 crossing the highway from one private property to another, including  
18 an implement of husbandry as defined by regulation;

19 (2) driven or moved on a highway under a dealer's plate or  
20 temporary permit as provided for in AS 28.10.031 and 28.10.181(j);

21 (3) special mobile equipment as defined by regulation;

22 (4) owned by the United States;

23 (5) moved by human or animal power;

24 (6) exempt under 50 U.S.C. App. 501-591 (Soldier's and  
25 Sailor's Civil Relief Act);

26 (7) driven or parked only on private property;

27 (8) the vehicle of a nonresident as provided under AS 28.-  
28 10.121;

29 (9) a commercial interstate vehicle under AS 28.10.141;

(10) transported under a special permit under AS 28.10.151;

(11) being driven or moved on a highway, vehicular way, or a public parking place in the state that is not connected by a land highway or vehicular way to

(A) the land-connected state highway system, or

(B) a highway or vehicular way with an average daily traffic volume greater than 499;

(12) a mobile home as defined by regulation;

(13) an implement of husbandry operated in accordance with the provisions of AS 19.10.065.
