1 Relating to suspension of a student from a public school.

3 * Section 1. AS 14.30.045 is amended to read:

4 Sec. 14.30.045. GROUNDS FOR SUSPENSION OR DENIAL OF
5 ADMISSION. A school age child may be suspended from or denied admission to the
6 public school that the child is otherwise entitled to attend only for the following
7 causes:

8 (1) continued wilful disobedience or open and persistent defiance of
9 reasonable school authority;

10 (2) behavior that is inimicable to the welfare, safety, or morals of other
11 pupils or a person employed or volunteering at the school;

12 (3) a physical or mental condition that in the opinion of a competent
13 medical authority will render the child unable to reasonably benefit from the programs
14 available;

15 (4) a physical or mental condition that in the opinion of a competent
16 medical authority will cause the attendance of the child to be inimicable to the welfare

2 (5) conviction of a felony that the governing body of the district
3 determines will cause the attendance of the child to be inimicable to the welfare or
4 education of other pupils.

6 Sec. 14.40.240. POWER OF PRESIDENT TO SUSPEND AND EXPEL
7 STUDENTS. The power to suspend and expel a student for misconduct or other cause
8 and to reinstate the student is vested solely in the president of the University of
9 Alaska. The president may delegate the exercise of the power to the chancellor
10 or another official on each campus of the university or to the administrative head
11 or director of a community college or other campus or extended unit of the
12 university.
