10 another state who, at the time of the possession, is

11 (A) certified as a peace officer by the other state; and

4 (5) "police officer" means

5 (A) a full-time employee of the state or a municipal [LOCAL]
6 police department with the authority to arrest and issue citations; detain a
7 person taken into custody until that person can be arraigned before a judge or
8 magistrate; conduct investigations of violations of and enforce criminal laws,
9 regulations, and traffic laws; search with or without a warrant persons,
10 dwellings, and other forms of property for evidence of a crime; [CARRY A
11 CONCEALED WEAPON;] and take other action consistent with exercise of
12 these enumerated powers when necessary to maintain the public peace;

13 (B) an officer or employee of the Department of Transportation
14 and Public Facilities who is stationed at an international airport and has been
15 designated to have the general police powers authorized under AS 02.15.230(a);

16 (C) a University of Alaska public safety officer with general
17 police powers authorized under AS 14.40.043;

18 * Sec. 3. This Act takes effect on the date HCS CSSB 141(FIN) am H, enacted by the
19 Twentieth Alaska State Legislature, takes effect.
