

Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) Dollars, or imprisonment in jail for not more than one year, or by both such fine and imprisonment. Provided, however, that the court may suspend sentence for a violation of the provisions of this Act and impose conditions as to conduct in the premises of any person so convicted, and make suspension to depend upon the fulfilment by such person of such conditions, and in case of the breach of such conditions, or any thereof, the court may impose sentence as though there had been no suspension.

CHAPTER 104.

AN ACT

[S. B. 63]

To make an appropriation for scholarships for certain high school graduates in the Territory, to attend the Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That the high school student in each graduating class in the several high schools of the Territory who, upon the completion of four years of high school work in the high schools of the Territory, obtained the highest average standing for all the credits earned, and who graduated at the annual commencements in 1929 and 1930, is hereby entitled to receive during dormitory residence at the Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines a scholarship covering dormitory rent for a period of two years, next succeeding the year of graduation, upon presenting to the Registrar of the College a certificate signed by the Superintendent of the high school from which such student is graduated stating that the graduate therein named is entitled to receive the benefits of the scholarship herein provided.

Section 2. In the event any graduate entitled to receive the benefits of the provisions of this Act declines or fails to accept the scholarship herein provided the graduate standing next in line in class standing shall be entitled to receive the benefits of the provisions of this Act.

Certificate to, issued when.

Section 3. All certificates shall be applied for and issued to graduates on or before the first day of August of each year and shall be reported forthwith by the Superintendent issuing the same to the Registrar of the College.

Benefits forfeited when—

Section 4. Failure to do passing work in more than one subject during any semester, withdrawal from the College, or expulsion shall constitute a forfeiture during the following semester or semesters of the benefits herein provided.

Appropriation.

Section 5. For the year 1929-1930 there is hereby appropriated from the Treasury of the Territory of Alaska to be expended for the purpose herein designated the sum of Eleven Hundred (\$1100.00) Dollars, and for the year 1930-31 the sum of Two Thousand Two Hundred (\$2,200.00) Dollars, or so much thereof as may be required.

Payments to be made when—

Section 6. Payment of the scholarships herein provided is to be made monthly to the College upon vouchers drawn upon the Territorial Treasurer and duly certified by the Treasurer and the President of the Board of Trustees of the College.
