CHAPTER 30.

AN ACT

[H. B. 211]

Requiring that all Territorial and Municipal employees in Alaska be citizens of the United States and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Territorial and
municipal
employees to be
citizens.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for the Territory of Alaska, or any municipality in the Territory of Alaska to employ at any rate of compensation as officer, agent or servant, any person who is not a citizen of the United States.

Emergency.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval.
