

CHAPTER 4.

AN ACT

[S. B. 10]

To amend Section 1299 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska, as amended by Chapter 15 of the 1923 Session Laws of the Territory of Alaska prescribing grounds for divorce, repealing Chapter Sixty-Nine of the 1927 Session Laws of the Territory of Alaska, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 1299 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska as amended by Chapter 15 of the 1923 Session Laws be amended so as to read as follows:

For what causes marriage contracts may be dissolved.

The dissolution of the marriage contract may be declared in the action of the injured party for either of the following causes:

First: Impotency existing at the time of the marriage and continuing at the commencement of the action.

Second: Adultery.

Third: Conviction of a felony.

Fourth: Wilful desertion for the period of one year.

✓ Fifth: Cruel and inhuman treatment calculated to impair the health or endanger life or personal indignities rendering life burdensome.

Sixth: Habitual gross drunkenness contracted since marriage and continuing for one year prior to the commencement of the action.

— Seventh: Wilful neglect of the husband for the period of twelve months to provide for his wife the common necessities of life, he having the ability to do so, or his failure to do so by reason of idleness, profligacy or dissipation.

Section 2. That Chapter Sixty-Nine of the 1927 Ses- ^{Repeal.}
sion Laws of the Territory of Alaska be, and the same
is hereby repealed.

Section 3. An emergency is declared to exist and this ^{Emergency.}
Act shall be in full force and effect upon its passage
and approval.

CHAPTER 5.

AN ACT

[S. B. 13]

To amend Section 24 of Chapter 97 of the 1923 Session Laws
relative to the power of the Municipal Magistrate, repeal-
ing Chapter 61 of the 1927 Session Laws, and declaring
an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 24 Chapter 97 of the 1923
Session Laws be amended by adding thereto the follow-
ing:

A judgment in the court of a Municipal
Magistrate shall be enforced in the same man-
ner as provided by law for the enforcement of
judgments in the court of a Justice of the
Peace. Executions shall be addressed to the
Chief of Police or any police officer of the city
and the levy thereof, as well as all other pro-
ceedings thereunder, shall be the same as in
the court of a Justice of the Peace.

Section 2. Chapter 61 of the 1927 Session Laws is ^{Repeal.}
hereby repealed.

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, ^{Emergency.}
and this Act shall take effect and be in force from and
after its passage and approval.
