

which bond shall be conditioned that the said bidder shall enter into and carry out the provisions of the contract for which he bid. Proper bonds shall be required of all contractors for the faithful carrying out of all contracts, all such bonds to run to and in favor of the Territory of Alaska. Partial payments may be made from time to time to the contractors, in the discretion of the Commissioner, but not more than sixty per cent of the contract price may be paid before the completion and acceptance of the school house and its equipment, if any, by the Commissioner. The date of acceptance shall not be less than sixty (60) days from the date of completion given by the contractor, which notice shall be under oath to the effect that the contract has been completed and that all claims of every kind and nature have been paid.

Section 4. No part of the sum hereby appropriated or of any other Territorial moneys, may be used for the purchase, rental or acquisition of the grounds on which such school house is built but the same shall be constructed on the grounds now owned and used by the Territory for school purposes at the said Town of Kodiak.

Section 5. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 74.

AN ACT

[H. B. 16]

To provide for the suppression of predatory animals, making an appropriation therefor, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. The Governor is authorized to take charge of and superintend the work and operations of sup-
Suppression of predatory animals.

pressing predatory animals in the Territory, and to that end he is authorized to employ not to exceed two expert hunters and trappers who shall operate pursuant to the provisions of this Act, and who will hereafter be referred to as leaders. Only such persons shall be so employed who have had a scientific training by the Department of Agriculture for the suppression of predatory animals and who are recognized by that Department as experts in that field.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of such leaders to give instructions to interested persons in the best method for hunting and trapping and otherwise destroying predatory animals, and to submit to the Governor from time to time plans for the most effective methods for carrying out the purpose of this Act.

Assistants

Upon recommendation of the leaders the Governor shall have authority to appoint not to exceed 4 men who shall be bona fide residents of the Territory of Alaska to operate as hunters and trappers under the direction of, as assistants to and as apprentices of said leaders at such places and times and for such periods as the Governor may approve.

Section 3. The Governor shall fix the rate of compensation and is authorized to pay necessary subsistence and traveling expenses for all leaders employed pursuant to the provisions of this Act, provided, however, that the leaders shall not be paid a salary at the rate of more than \$3,600.00 per year each. The Governor shall determine whether a salary shall be paid all or part time to the assistants but the salary shall not exceed \$150.00 per month per man. The skins taken shall be the property of the Territory and shall be sold under directions of the Governor at public auction, at such place as in his judgment the highest prices may be obtained.

Limitation.

In addition to their compensation, as above provided for, the hunters and trappers may be furnished with the necessary equipment, supplies and traveling expenses in whole or in part. All expenditures under this Act whether for salary or otherwise shall be paid by the Treasurer of the Territory upon vouchers approved by the Governor. Payments,
how made.

Section 4. The moneys derived from sale of skins pursuant to the provisions of the foregoing section shall be covered into the Treasury of the Territory. Revenue
covered into
treasury.

Section 5. The sum of Thirty Thousand (\$30,000.00) Dollars, or so much thereof as shall be necessary is hereby appropriated out of the moneys of the Territory to carry out the provisions of this Act. Appropriation.

Section 6. That during the period from the date of the passage of this Act to and including March 31, 1931, no indebtedness or obligation shall be incurred hereunder over and above the amount appropriated by this Act. No deficiency.

Section 7. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval. Emergency.

CHAPTER 75.

AN ACT

[H. B. 45]

Concerning the licensing of airmen and aircraft, concerning air traffic rules, and to make uniform the law with reference thereto.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

The Term "Aircraft" means any contrivance now known or hereafter invented, used, or designed for navigation of or flight in the air, except at parachute
