

called Sunday or the Lord's day, such person, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than five nor more than fifty dollars; Provided, that the above provision shall not apply to the keep-^{Exception.}ers of theaters, moving picture houses, drug stores, doctor shops, undertakers, livery-stable keepers, barbers, butchers and bakers, and all circumstances of necessity and mercy may be pleaded in defense, which shall be treated as questions of fact for the jury to determine, when the offense is tried by jury."

CHAPTER 21.

AN ACT

[H. B. 32]

To defray emergency expense of extra help installing specimens and in assisting in moving library books from present Alaska Historical Library and Museum and Governor's Mansion to the new quarters of the Museum in the Capitol building, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That the sum of One Hundred and Fifty (\$150.00) Dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated to pay for extra help in installing specimens and in assisting in moving library books from present Alaska Historical Library and Museum and Governor's Mansion to the new quarters of the Museum in the Capitol building for the month of April, 1931, and the same shall be paid upon vouchers approved by the Governor. ^{Appropriation for payment of extra help in moving Museum specimens to Capitol.}

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval. ^{Emergency.}
