All money received by it from such sale or sales, shall be deposited in the treasury of the Territory of Alaska, and the Governor and the Secretary of the Territory are hereby authorized to execute in the name and under the Great Seal of said Territory such conveyance or conveyances as may be necessary or proper in the premises.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 3.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS, the Treasurer is directed, by House Joint Resolution No. 2, Session Laws of Alaska of 1927, to set aside \$40,000.00 each year for the purpose of creating a fund with which to pay the expense of erecting new buildings for a Pioneers' Home, and:

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the Territorial Legislature to extend all possible aid to the schools of the Territory, so that its children shall enjoy the best possible school facilities, and:

WHEREAS, there exists in the Town of Wrangell an emergency, owing to financial conditions in the United States, believed to be temporary, so that the sale of the school bonds voted by its people may be delayed, causing continued loss to the Town of Wrangell, and inefficiency in its school, because of lack of proper building and equipment,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, that the provision in House Joint Resolution No. 2, Session Laws of Alaska, 1927, requiring investment in Government bonds, be inoperative for the year 1931, and the Treasurer be authorized and directed to immediately purchase Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00) worth of the Wrangell School Bonds for the 1931 investment of the Pioneers' Home Building Fund.

This change shall not be operative except for the year 1931; thereafter the Treasurer shall invest the money as heretofore directed.

Proviso: The Banking Board is hereby authorized to sell the bonds at any time they deem advisable, Provided, however, that should a contingency arise at any time necessitating the sale of said bonds, and the Territorial Banking Board be unable to sell same for the full par value, there shall be no liability attached against the bond of the Territorial Treasurer for any loss sustained by the sale of said bonds, unless due to the carelessness, negligence or collusion of the Treasurer. The bonds when so sold by the Banking Board shall be transferred to the purchaser without recourse against the Territory.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 4.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska that the committees of Printing and Purchasing of the Senate and House, acting jointly, shall have five hundred (500) copies printed of the report of the Territorial Highway Engineer for the Biennium of 1929-31, and that such expense be covered in the General Appropriation Bill.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 5.

WHEREAS, Radio Station KFQD of Anchorage, Alaska, has applied to the Federal Radio Commission for increase of power from one hundred (100) to five hundred (500) watts; and

WHEREAS, said station is well constructed and efficiently managed and operated and it is performing a very valuable public service in Alaska by the broadcasting of information to men who reside in remote sections and have no other convenient means of obtaining news from the outside world; and

WHEREAS, the operation of said station is particularly vital in connection with transportation by air in the vast and sparsely settled regions of Alaska; and
