Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist Emergency. and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 104.

AN ACT

[H. B. 53]

To appropriate funds for the payment of deficiency under Chapter 82, Session Laws 1929, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. The sum of Eleven Hundred Thirty (\$1130.00) Dollars is hereby appropriated from the Treasury of the Territory for the purpose of paying, not to exceed One Hundred and Fifty (\$150.00) Dollars per year for the maintenance of each public library, incorporated, as provided in Chapter 82, Session Laws of 1929. Supplemental appropriation for Public Libraries.

This appropriation is supplementary to the appropriation heretofore made for that purpose for the biennium ended March 31, 1933.

Emergency.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared and this Act shall take effect upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 105.

AN ACT

[H. B. 40]

To provide for the dissemination of news, executive proclamation and inquiries, information concerning the Territory and other general information by radio broadcasting, making provision for payments of the same, repealing Chapter 86 of the 1931 Session Laws, and declaring an emergency to give this Act immediate effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. The Governor of Alaska is hereby authorized and empowered to employ some radio station, or stations, situated south of the Gulf of Alaska and suitable for distribution or the dissemination of news, executive proclamations and inquiries, information concerning the Territory of Alaska, general information and such other matters suitable for broadcasting as the Governor of Alaska shall prescribe and as may be of service and benefit to the people to be served.

Section 2. The radio station, or stations, used for said purposes shall have the following qualifications:

(a) The station shall hold a valid license from the Federal Radio Commission to operate a broadcasting station of not less than 250 Watt capacity within the Territory of Alaska.

(b) The station, or stations, employed shall have actually operated radio broadcasting continuously for at least one year prior to the date of its employment
