

reimbursed by the Treasurer of the Territory of Alaska the exact amount by such public school teacher contributed out of his or her wages under the aforesaid section.

(2) No payment or refund shall be made except upon application of such public school teacher, properly verified and filed in the office of the Commissioner of Education and approved by him.

Section 3. All funds herein appropriated, not re-  
funded as herein provided, within a period of seven  
years from the date of passage and approval of this  
Act, shall be covered into the General Fund of the  
Territory. Refunds not  
made, when to  
revert.

Section 4. An emergency is hereby declared to exist  
and this Act shall be in full force and effect upon its  
passage and approval. Emergency.

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## CHAPTER 109.

### AN ACT

[S. B. 124]

To create the Board of Liquor Control and prescribe its powers and duties.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. There is hereby created a Board of Liquor  
Control to be composed of the Governor, the Attorney  
General, the Treasurer, the Auditor, and the Territorial  
Highway Engineer, all executive officials of the Terri-  
tory of Alaska. Board of Liquor  
Control created.

Board to pre-  
scribe rules and  
regulations, etc.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of the Board of Liquor Control to prescribe rules and regulations to govern the manufacture, barter, sale, and possession of intoxicating liquors in the Territory of Alaska; to prescribe the qualifications of those who are to engage in the manufacture, barter, sale, and possession of intoxicating liquors in the Territory of Alaska, and to prescribe license fees and excise taxes therefor.

When board  
may exercise  
powers.

Section 3. The said Board shall become effective and shall exercise its powers, duties, and functions from the time when the Secretary of State of the United States of America shall publish a proclamation that the Repeal of the Eighteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States of America has been ratified and confirmed, as required by the Constitution and the laws of the United States of America, and when the manufacture, barter, sale, and possession of intoxicating liquor becomes lawful in the Territory of Alaska.

Powers of  
board—  
limitations.

Section 4. The Board of Liquor Control is to have full power, authority and control over the manufacture, barter, sale, and possession of intoxicating liquors in the Territory of Alaska, as provided in Section 3 of this Act, until such a time as the Legislature of Alaska may enact laws that will provide for and supersede the powers, duties, and functions hereby delegated to the Board of Liquor Control.
