CHAPTER 117.

AN ACT

[S. B. 91]

To provide for the installation, maintenance and operation of a radio telephone system in this Territory; to make an appropriation for that purpose; to repeal Chapter 90, Session Laws of Alaska, 1931.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. The Territorial Board of Road Commissioners is hereby granted authority to cause to be installed, established, maintained and operated a radio telephone system throughout the Territory; to connect or cause the same to be connected and operated in conjunction with radio and other stations of communication maintained and/or operated by the United States through the Washington Alaska Military Cable and Telegraph system or other agency; to co-operate with the United States and the officers in charge of said or any other system of communication; it shall promulgate rules and regulations for the use, conduct and operation of such stations and to fix the tolls to be collected from patrons and the manner and method of accounting for the same; all net tolls collected shall be covered into the Territorial Treasury there to be kept in a special fund to be designated "Radio Telephone Fund", to be expended for the maintenance of the Radio Telephone system.

Appropriation.

Section 2. The sum of \$20,000 is hereby appropriated out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated to be allotted in equal shares to the four judicial divisions of the Territory for the installation, maintenance and operation of said system and to be paid out upon vouchers approved by the Highway Engineer.

Board of Road Commissioners to determine location of phones.

Section 3. Radio telephone stations may be established at such places where, in the sound opinion of the Territorial Board of Road Commissioners, the benefits and advantages fairly expected to be derived therefrom, justify the cost of installation and maintenance.

Communities to pay 25% of landed cost of equipment, etc.

Section 4. No radio telephone station shall be established in any place unless the inhabitants of the community in which it is to be established, or the community residing adjacent thereto, shall contribute 25% of the landed cost of the equipment and of the installation thereof and agree to contribute, if necessary, to the maintenance of the station.

Reports of operator—fees.

Section 5. On the first day of each month the operator or person in charge of every radio telephone station established and operated under the provisions of this Act, shall report to the Highway Engineer, upon blanks to be furnished by him, an itemized account of business transacted at his station during the preceding month, the charges made, the tolls collected and the total expense incurred in the operation and maintenance of his station; at the same time he shall transmit to the Territorial Treasurer all net tolls collected by him from the operation of his station during the preceding month.
