

CHAPTER 118.

AN ACT

[S. B. 123]

To amend Section 691 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1913.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 691 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1913 be, and the same is, hereby amended to read as follows:

“Section 691. Every mechanic, artisan, machinist, contractor, lumber merchant, laborer, teamster, drayman, and other persons performing labor upon or furnishing material of any kind to be used in the construction, alteration or repair, either in whole or in part, of any building, wharf, bridge, flume, fence, machinery or aqueduct, or any structure or superstructure, shall have a lien upon the same for the work or labor done or material furnished at the instance of the owner of the building or other improvement, or his agent.”

CHAPTER 119.

AN ACT

[S. B. 130]

For the purpose of aiding, as far as the Territory is financially able, in providing relief and work relief for persons affected by the conditions set forth in Senate Bill No. 128 (Chapter 115, Sessions Laws of Alaska, 1933), for the biennium ending March 31, 1935 and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Insofar as the Territory is financially able, the following sums or so much thereof as shall be found necessary, are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury of the Territory of Alaska not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of aiding in pro-

CHAPTER 120.

AN ACT

[H. B. 116]

To appropriate for the expenses of the Territory of Alaska for the biennium beginning April 1, 1933 and ending March 31, 1935, and for the school years commencing July 1, 1933 and ending June 30, 1934 and commencing July 1, 1934, and ending June 30, 1935, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:
