## CHAPTER 26.

### AN ACT

[S. B. 38]

To amend Sections 971, 972, 973, 975 and 1107, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1913, providing a method for levying upon and selling shares of stock in corporations.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That Section 971 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1913, be, and the same is, hereby amended to read as follows:

What property  
may be  
attached.

“Section 971. All property in this Territory of such defendant, not exempt from execution, shall be liable to be attached. The marshal shall note upon the writ the date of its delivery to him, and shall make a full inventory of the property attached, and return the same with the writ.”

Section 2. That Section 972 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1913, be, and the same is, hereby amended, by striking from subsection three thereof, the following words:

“Or if it be rights or shares in the stock of any association or corporation, or interests or profits thereof, then with such person or officer of such association or corporation, as this Code authorizes a summons to be served upon.”

Section 3. That Section 973 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1913, be, and the same is, hereby amended by striking from line eight thereof, the word "STOCK".

Section 4. That Section 975 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1913, be, and the same is, hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 975. Whenever the marshal with a writ of attachment shall apply to any person mentioned in subdivision three of section 972, for the purpose of attaching any property mentioned therein, such person shall furnish him with a certificate designating the amount and description of any property in his possession belonging to the defendant, or any debt owing to the defendant. If such person refuse to do so, or if the certificate when given be unsatisfactory to the plaintiff, he may be required by the court or judge thereof, where the action is pending, to appear before him and be examined on oath concerning the same and disobedience to such an order may be punished as contempt."

When third person must furnish certificate to Marshal.

Section 5. That Section 1107 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1913, be, and the same is, hereby amended by striking therefrom all of paragraph Second thereof.
