

CHAPTER 61.

AN ACT

[H. B. 52]

To amend Chapter 31 Session Laws of 1917 by adding thereto a section, (to be numbered section 6) limiting the amount of money to be expended in the rescue and/or relief of a person lost and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Chapter 31 of the Session Laws of Alaska, 1917, be, and the same is, hereby amended by adding thereto a section, to be numbered "section 6" to read as follows:

Limitation of
expense of
search, unless—

"Section 6. That no United States Commissioner or Postmaster shall obligate or bind the Territory in a greater sum than one hundred fifty (\$150.00) dollars in any one case of rescue or relief, without the affirmative approval of the Governor shall first have been obtained; when the Governor gives such approval he shall state therein the additional amount that may be expended, if necessary, in each case, and such approval shall be attached to the vouchers of the Commissioner or Postmaster, as the case may be."

Emergency.

Section 2. This Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.
