

Senate Concurrent Resolutions

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 1.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate and the House of Representatives concurring that a joint session of the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska be held in the hall of the House of Representatives at the Capital at Juneau, Alaska, at the hour of 2 o'clock in the afternoon of Wednesday, March 8th, 1933, for the purpose of receiving the biennial message of the Governor of the Territory of Alaska.

Passed by the Senate, March 7th, 1933.

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 2.

WHEREAS, it has been customary for a Joint Committee of The Senate and House of Representatives of the Territorial Legislature to visit the Alaska Pioneers' Home, at Sitka, for the purpose of looking into the management thereof and investigating the needs of the institution; and,

WHEREAS, it is necessary and proper that such a visit be made during this session for the purposes hereinabove set forth;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, and the House of Representatives concurring, that a Joint Committee, to consist of four (4) members of the Senate and eight (8) members of the House, be appointed to visit the Alaska Pioneers' Home during this, the Eleventh Session of the Legislature, with instructions to look into the management of the institution and the needs thereof, and to report its findings and recommendations, if any, to both Houses of the Legislature, at an early date.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that said Committee shall be authorized, if necessary, to hold hearings, summon witnesses, administer oaths to such witnesses, and take their testimony, as provided by Chapter 6, Session Laws of Alaska, 1917.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Committee be authorized to arrange for the necessary transportation for carrying out the provisions of this Resolution.

Passed by the Senate, March 20, 1933.

Passed by the House, March 22, 1933.

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Senate of the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, the House of Representatives concurring:

That Section 8, of the Joint Rules of the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Territory of Alaska, be, and the same is, hereby amended to read as follows:

"8. Every Bill when passed by the house in which it originated shall be immediately engrossed and certified by the presiding officer and clerk and sent to the other house for consideration, and the clerk of the house in which the bill originated shall transmit with the engrossed bill sufficient copies of such engrossed bill for distribution to the members of the other house, the clerk or secretary retaining a copy certified by said clerk or secretary. Whenever a bill, intended to amend an existing statute is engrossed, it shall be prepared and engrossed in the manner prescribed in Joint Rule 27."

Passed the Senate April 1, 1933.

Passed the House April 15, 1933.

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 4.

The Senate and the House of Representatives of the Territory of Alaska knowing that the condition of industrial depression which has existed throughout the United States for the last three years has caused widespread unemployment among all classes of people in Alaska as well as elsewhere; and

That in many instances married women whose husbands are gainfully employed are holding positions in the schools and offices of this Territory, thereby preventing those in distress from obtaining needed employment:
