

Senate Joint Resolutions

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 1.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Senate of the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, the House of Representatives concurring, that in the appointments to office in the Federal administrative and judicial branches of government in the Territory of Alaska, the President of the United States is respectfully requested to make such appointments only from bona fide residents of the Territory of Alaska, who are otherwise qualified.

THAT, the term "bona fide" as used in this resolution, means actual residents of Alaska whose residence does not depend upon political office and does not include former residents of Alaska who have left the Territory and established residence elsewhere, and we further respectfully request and welcome a thorough investigation of the qualifications and fitness of each applicant for the respective positions.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That a certified copy of this resolution be presented by our Delegate in Congress to the PRESIDENT of the United States of America.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 2.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS, under an Act of the Territorial Legislature approved April 30th, 1931, the same being Chapter 90 of the 1931 Session Laws of Alaska, the Governor of Alaska was authorized to appoint a commission of five members, two of whom were to be residents of the First Judicial Division and each of the other

judicial divisions was to be represented by one resident as member of the commission, which commission was to be known as the "Alaska World's Fair Commission" and was to arrange for Alaska exhibits in conjunction or co-operation with the Federal government and had authority to incur obligations in amounts aggregating not more than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00), and the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) was appropriated to be paid on vouchers approved by the Governor; and

WHEREAS, the Alaska World's Fair Commission was not appointed and no part of the appropriation of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) has been expended;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Governor of Alaska be authorized to spend the sum of Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$3,500.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, for Alaska exhibits at the World's Fair in Chicago, in conjunction or co-operation with the Federal government or as he may otherwise direct.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 3.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

That the Governor of Alaska be, and he hereby is, authorized to employ, for such number of hours per day and for such compensation as shall to him seem necessary and reasonable, a janitor to clean, care for and keep in proper order the rooms occupied by the Legislature; and that the expenses necessarily incurred therefor, not in any event to exceed Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00), shall be paid by the Treasurer to the Territory of Alaska, upon vouchers signed by the Governor, or otherwise as may be provided by law.
