

judicial divisions was to be represented by one resident as member of the commission, which commission was to be known as the "Alaska World's Fair Commission" and was to arrange for Alaska exhibits in conjunction or co-operation with the Federal government and had authority to incur obligations in amounts aggregating not more than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00), and the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) was appropriated to be paid on vouchers approved by the Governor; and

WHEREAS, the Alaska World's Fair Commission was not appointed and no part of the appropriation of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) has been expended;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Governor of Alaska be authorized to spend the sum of Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$3,500.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, for Alaska exhibits at the World's Fair in Chicago, in conjunction or co-operation with the Federal government or as he may otherwise direct.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 3.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

That the Governor of Alaska be, and he hereby is, authorized to employ, for such number of hours per day and for such compensation as shall to him seem necessary and reasonable, a janitor to clean, care for and keep in proper order the rooms occupied by the Legislature; and that the expenses necessarily incurred therefor, not in any event to exceed Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00), shall be paid by the Treasurer to the Territory of Alaska, upon vouchers signed by the Governor, or otherwise as may be provided by law.
