

CHAPTER 37.

AN ACT

[S. B. 36]

To abolish estate by the curtesy and to amend Sec. 4601, Compiled Laws of Alaska, relative thereto.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

That Sec. 4601, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

“Section 4601. Estate by Curtesy Abolished: Wife may sell without husband joining.

When any man and his wife shall be seized in her right of an estate of inheritance in lands, the wife may sell or convey such property without her husbands joining in the conveyance, or may dispose of the same by will, and when so sold or conveyed, or disposed of by will, such property shall not be subject to any estate by the curtesy as known to the common law. Upon the death of the wife intestate such property shall descend to her heirs according to the laws of inheritance in this Territory.
