

examine and survey the progress of the collection of revenues out of which all appropriations may be payable, and, from time to time, to declare and determine which of such special appropriations shall be utilized for the purposes mentioned in such appropriation, out of available funds not needed for the payment of appropriations specifically excepted herefrom. In making such examination and survey, said Board may require estimates of the prospective collection of revenues from the Treasurer, Auditor, tax and license collectors, and any other revenue assessing or collecting agency of the territory having information which, in the opinion of the Board of Administration, may be pertinent. The purpose and policy of this Act are to provide and insure that, at the end of the fiscal period, no overdraft or deficit, growing out of appropriations, shall exist in the general fund of the Territorial Treasury, and the Board of Administration is directed so to administer this Act as to prevent any such overdraft or deficit.

## CHAPTER 28.

### AN ACT

[H. B. 33]

To provide for a seal for the office of the Auditor of Alaska, a seal for the office of Registrar of Vital Statistics, and to provide for the certification and authentication of the records of the said offices by the Chief Clerk thereof, whenever same is necessary.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Sec. 1. The Auditor of Alaska shall have a seal of office, which shall be two and one-half inches in

diameter and bear, just within the perimeter of the seal, the words "Seal of the Auditor of the Territory of Alaska", and within the circle at the top of the seal, a star, representing the North Star, beneath this star the dipper made up of five stars, and beneath said dipper, a quill.

Sec. 2. That the said seal shall be used in the preparation of all certified or authenticated copies of original records in the office of the Auditor of Alaska.

Sec. 3. The Auditor of Alaska, as Registrar of Vital Statistics, shall have a seal as such, which shall be two and one-half inches in diameter and bear within the perimeter of the seal the words "Seal of the Registrar of Vital Statistics of Alaska", and within the circle, at the top of the seal, a star representing the North Star, beneath it the dipper of seven stars, and beneath this a quill.

Sec. 4. The Chief Clerk in the office of the Auditor of Alaska shall be empowered to certify and authenticate copies of original records in the said office in the name of the Auditor, and to attach the seal provided herein to the same, and shall have a similar power with reference to copies of all original records filed with Registrar of Vital Statistics.
