Section 2703. **Territorial moneys covered into Territorial Treasury.** Every office, board, commission or bureau authorized to collect or receive any fees, licenses, taxes or other money, and every office, commission or bureau of the United States, or other authorized agency, authorized to collect any fees, licenses, taxes or other money belonging to this Territory, shall account for and pay such fees, licenses, taxes or other money, less any fees he may be entitled to under existing law, to the Territorial Treasurer at least once each month and the same be covered into the general fund.

Emergency.

Section 4. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 73.

AN ACT

[S. B. 24]

To amend Sections 1531, 1532, and 1533, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, relating to absentee voting.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Amended.

That Sections 1531, 1532, and 1533, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, be amended to read as follows:

Absentee elec-
tor may vote at
general elec-
tion, if—

Section 1531. **Absentee Voting Authorized.** Any elector of the Territory who believes that he will be unavoidably absent from his home, and more than 2 miles distant from the voting place in which he is qualified to vote, may vote at any general election in the manner provided for in this Article.

Section 1532. Application For Official Ballot; When To Be Made. Any elector desiring to vote under the provisions of this Article shall not more than 40 days, nor less then 2 days before such general election, apply in person or by letter to any Commissioner of the precinct of which he is a resident, or to a Notary Public for the Territory of Alaska, for an official ballot.

Elector to apply to commissioner for official ballot, when.

Section 1533. Examination Of Elector; Issuance Of Ballot; Procedure. The Commissioner or Notary Public shall make an examination of the applicant touching his qualifications as an elector, and if he is satisfied that such applicant is a duly qualified elector in the precinct in which he claims to be a resident, he shall remove and keep the numbered stubs from an official blank ballot for such election, and deliver the same unmarked to the elector. He shall also deliver to the elector a small envelope that shall have upon it no mark which may serve to identify it, or the ballot within it, with the voter, and a larger envelope upon which there shall be printed the name and post office address of the Clerk of the District Court issuing the same, and a blank affidavit in the following form:

Subscribed and sworn before me, a Commissioner in and for the Precinct, Territory of Alaska, or Notary Public. I hereby certify that the affiant has proven himself to be the person whom he represents himself to be; that I delivered to him the ballot herein enclosed and that the same was then unmarked; that the affiant, before me, at the same time and place, marked this ballot but in such manner that neither I, nor any one else saw his vote; that he then folded, enclosed and sealed said ballot so marked, in a small envelope, and then enclosed and sealed said small envelope in this envelope, which he handed to me, sealed, to be forwarded by me to the Clerk of the District Court for the Judicial Division, Territory of Alaska.
