

License officers.

Section 14. The Territorial Treasurer may appoint at a salary not to exceed more than Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) per month not less than four, nor more than six, License Officers, who shall have the powers now exercised by United States Marshals in the enforcement of the laws of the Territory. They may also be designated Deputy Collectors of Licenses and Taxes under such rules and regulations as the Treasurer may prescribe and shall give bond to the Territory in such sum as the Treasurer may prescribe for the faithful performance of their duties and accounting for all moneys that may come into their hands.

Saving clause.

Section 15. If any section, sub-section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Act is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, such decision shall not be held to affect the validity of any other portion of this Act.

Conflicting acts repealed.

Section 16. All Acts and parts of Acts in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

CHAPTER 79.**AN ACT**

[S. B. 73]

To amend Section 1663, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Amended.

Section 1. That Section 1663, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, be, and the same is, hereby amended by adding thereto a new paragraph, to be known as Paragraph 10, to read as follows:

Paragraph 10. The Commissioner of Health is hereby authorized and directed to establish a department, charged with the duty of prescribing and carrying out a general plan for the hospitalization, care and treatment of crippled and otherwise deformed children and of children who suffer from afflictions likely to result in their becoming crippled or otherwise deformed.

Provision for Hospitalization, care and treatment of crippled and deformed children.

The Commissioner shall:

(a) Supervise the said department and administer the same; prescribe and carry out, or cause to be carried out, a course for the care, hospitalization and treatment of such children and secure medical, surgical and other professional services for them.

Duties of Health Commissioner.

(b) Cooperate with the Government of the United States or any of its agencies or officers engaged or concerned in like or similar service, and receive all sums of money made available by the Federal Government, the Territory or any political sub-division thereof, for any or all of the purposes herein contemplated.

Cooperation with U. S. Government.

Section 2. All sums of money received from the Federal Government or any of its agencies or officers, or appropriated by the Territory or any political sub-division thereof, for any of the purposes in this Section intended or provided for, shall be expended under the supervision of the Commissioner of Health and shall be paid out upon under vouchers approved by the Governor.

Monies—How expended.
