

by Chapter 89, Session Laws of Alaska, 1935, shall be and are hereby extended to apply to every domestic business corporation, that is every corporation organized under the provisions of Chapter 8, Session Laws of Alaska, 1931, codified in Sections 901 to 936, inclusive, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, or any laws amendatory thereof.

Section 2. The time for domestic business corporations to file the certificates of designation of agents shall be as follows:

Domestic Business Corporations: certificates of designation of agents, time for filing—fee.

(a): As to domestic business corporations already existing on or before January 1, 1942.

(b): As to domestic business corporations hereafter organized within sixty days from the date of incorporation which for purposes of this Act shall be the date the articles of incorporation are filed with the Auditor of Alaska.

Section 3. A fee of \$5 shall be charged by the Auditor and paid to him for the filing of any appointment or designation of agent, or for a revocation thereof.

CHAPTER 44.

AN ACT

[S. B. 31]

To amend Section 2161, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933; fixing the time for the payment of temporary disability compensation and defining "wage earning capacity" of an employee suffering from temporary disability.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Section 2161, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, be, and the same is hereby amended by adding to

the last paragraph of Column one on page 437, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, the following:

Workmen's
Compensation;
Temporary
disability, when
paid.

“Payment for such temporary disability shall be made at the time compensation is customarily paid for labor performed or services rendered at the plant or establishment of the employer liable therefor and not less than once a month in any event.

“Daily average
wages,” how
determined.

The average daily wage earning capacity of an injured employee in case of temporary disability shall be determined by his actual earnings if such actual earnings fairly and reasonably represent his daily wage earning capacity. If such earnings do not fairly and reasonably represent his daily wage earning capacity, the court or jury shall, in the interest of justice, fix such daily wage earning capacity as shall be reasonable and have a due regard for the nature of his injury, the degree of temporary impairment, his usual employment and any other factor or circumstance in the case which may affect his capacity to earn wages in his temporary disabled condition.”

CHAPTER 45.

AN ACT

[H. B. 25]

To regulate the sale, gift, barter, exchange or distribution of amytal, luminal, veronal, barbital, acid diethyl-barbituric and their derivatives; chloral-hydrate, and para-amino-benzene sulfonamide and their derivatives, providing a penalty.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation, to sell, give away, barter, exchange or
