

CHAPTER 58.

AN ACT

[S. B. 35, 67]

To make appropriations for payment for hospitalization and transportation furnished certain indigents and transportation furnished certain representatives of the Territory, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. The sum of \$253.00 is hereby appropriated out of moneys in the Territorial Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of paying the Star Air Lines, Inc. for aeroplane transportation rendered on account of the Territory of Alaska, in the following instances:

January 26, 1936, Dr. Lowell E. Williams, Seward to Susitna and return	\$ 90.00
May 10, 1939, Florence Wood, McGrath to Anchorage	15.00
August 2, 1939, Cornwall family, McGrath to Anchorage	100.00
December 19, 1939; Herman Hanson, McGrath to Anchorage	48.00

Section 2. The sum of \$545.00 is hereby appropriated out of moneys in the Territorial Treasury not otherwise appropriated for the purpose of paying the Seward General Hospital, Seward, Alaska, for 218 days of hospitalization furnished the following named indigents at the rate of \$2.50 per day:

Section 3. The sum of \$75 is hereby appropriated out of moneys in the Territorial Treasury not otherwise appropriated for the purpose of paying John M. Cross of Deering, Alaska, for aeroplane transportation furnished in November, 1940, to M. Hanson, a pioneer indigent, from Kiana to Kotzebue to Nome, Alaska.

Section 4. Payment of the appropriations herein provided shall be made on vouchers approved by the Governor of Alaska.

Governor to approve vouchers.

Section 5. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.
